Vanguard Emerging Markets Government Bond ETF Analyst Report

The Vanguard Emerging Markets Government Bond ETF (VWOB) tracks an index of U.S.-dollar denominated debt issued by emerging market governments. This ETF delivers exposure to an asset class that can enhance current returns and deliver geographic diversification, without subjecting investors to currency fluctuations. VWOB is one of the least expensive options available in the category and has significant assets and daily liquidity. Investors can compare VWOB to the iShares JPMorgan USD Emerging Markets Bond ETF (EMB), the JPMorgan USD Emerging Markets Sovereign Bond ETF (JPMB), or the Invesco Emerging Markets Sovereign Debt ETF (PCY).
